
Eight Weeks Of Education, Social Skills and Wellness

his was East Madison
Community Center's 50th
year of Summer Day Camp for
over 40 youth ages 7-11 from
Truax, Web Rethke, east side
of Madison and neighboring
communities like Sun Prairie,
Fitchburg, and one student even
came from Oakland California.
Summer Camp has had a
positive impact on youth by
furthering their academic skills
along with learning valuable

school and stressful situations. Youth also participate in wellness at least two hours a day to improve fitness levels and increase positive body image. Summer Day Camp runs from 9:00 am - 4:30 pm 5 days a week. This year's camp staff has over 60 years of camp experience working with youth. The staff consists of teachers, social workers, UW educational students, neighborhood residents and teen staff. Teens have to complete our job training program and have maintained over a 3.0 grade point average throughout the year. This year we had 8 youth counselors working at

EMCC is working with NewBridge to bring programs for older community members here at EMCC. The first event will be bingo for ages 50+.




THE MADISON PUBLIC LIBRARY


